Classification:

Danish Championships Middledistance
The race is a WRE race and points for the world ranking.

Driving directions and parking:

Marking on Rygbjergvej between Frederikshåb and Randbøl.
Parking on a grassy field close to the arena. Price DKK 20 (3 euro) per vehicle. The amount covers payment to the private owners of the parking space, event arena and forest. Foreign runners can pay at the competition office.

Venue:

Competition office:

At the event arena. Open from 10:00.
Club bags containing bibnumbers and rental tags are handed out club by club.

Distances and markings:

Parking to arena: 50-400 m
From arena to start: 1,200 m marked with blue flags. On part of the way to the start, follow an asphalt road. Use the left side and be aware of traffic.

Toilet and shower:

Toilets are available at the event arena and at the start.
Bath: Possibility of bathing in OK Gorm's clubhouse, Abrahamsens Gård, Skovgade 27C, Jelling. Distance: 20 km. Open from 15:00 to 19:00.

Control system, including place of delivery of rented SI units:

The race is run with Sport Ident Air+ Touch Free. Rented tags are handed out at the event office in club bags.

An unreturned rental tag must be replaced with DKK 600.

Any change of tag number must be made by contacting the event office, where a form is filled out. Runners who have forgotten their own tag, or are registered with a regular SI tag, can rent a replacement tag - SIAC - at the competition office on the day for a fee of DKK 30.

In case of failure of SportIdent, 3 spare fields have been set aside on the race map for manual punching.

The code is on the SI-unit, and can only be seen from above.

Map and terrain:Map:

The map was drawn by GT Maps in the autumn of 2024 and updated for the Easter Race 2025. In connection with DM Mellem, the map has been updated by members from OK Gorm spring/summer 2026. Printed on waterproof paper from Grafisk Forum.

The map is associated with a map consultant, but not awarded a quality label. This is because many vegetation objects do not comply with the norm's minimum sizes in special detailed areas. Since the norm is based on a scale of 1:15.000 – and the WRE is 1:10.000 – we have chosen to maintain a detailed drawing of the densities, as it best reflects the impression of the terrain. The latest orienteering map (Easter Race 2025) can be downloaded from the race's website.

Forbidden areas:

Forbidden areas marked with full IOF-band and also marked on the race map.

The terrain

Mixed state forest and private forest. Generally many trails. Many paths and cuts are characterized by tall grass. Contours with many small details. No major hills. A lot of spruce grows and it grows quickly, so there are many areas with dense spruce stands and otherwise a very varied permeability. Generally very dry forest. In the middle of the area, poles have been set for a larger animal fence. However, there is no thread on it and it is thus not shown on the map.

Control Descriptions:

Control descriptions are printed on the map. Loose control descriptions are provided in start box 2. May be used by participants with a suitable holder.

Dimensions control descriptions:

H21: 5 x 18 cm

D21: 5 x 17 cm

Starting procedure, checking and handing out maps, as well as late starting:

At the start there is a toilet and bags for transporting outerwear.

Warm-up must be done on the path before starting until the barrier is closed.

Outside the start box are notices with instructions and start lists. Start Lists will be ready Wednesday 3 days before the event.

Bib numbers:

All participants must wear bib numbers. Numbers are shown on the start list and are picked up at the competition office, packed in club bags. Check that you are taking the correct number.

Seeding

For the classes D/H21, seeding has been done by the DOF national coach according to rules for Danish Championships.

Start procedure

Clock shows the starting time.

4 minutes before start time. Box 1. The starting staff checks the name and SI tag.

At the exit from box 1 there is a clear/check unit. It is the runners own responsibility that the SI tag is cleared.

3 minutes before start time. Box 2. Loose control descriptions are offered here. May be used by participants with a suitable holder.

2 minutes before start time. Box 3

1 minute before start time. Box 4.

Runners advance to their map.

Map must only be taken out at the moment of starting. If this happens earlier, this is considered a false start.

The runner is responsible for taking the correct map at the start signal. There are plastic bags available if you want this, where the map can be put in after the start has passed

Late runners report to the start staff and follow their instructions.

Finish, maximum time, collection and later handing out of maps, liquid:

Finish: The touchfree device is stamped at the finish line and continued to SI Card-reading and handing out intermediate times.

A camera has been set up for backup at the finish.

The race map is collected and handed out club by club after the last start

Maximum time: 120 minutes

Liquid: There is water right after finish. In case of extraordinarily hot weather, there will be liquid at the start and in the forest

Speaking and results:

Speaking in all classes.

After the race, the results will be available on the race website. Results will also be shown on O-result and Winsplits and the courses will be available on O-Track and for H21 and D21 also on Livelox.

Service at the event arena:Kiosk:

There is a well-stocked kiosk at the competition site.

The kiosk offers grilled frankfurters with bread and various delicious sandwiches. Cake, liquorice and chocolate, coffee, soft drinks and beer are also available.

First aid:

There is first aid and a defibrillator at the event arena.

Transporting outerwear:

There is transport of outerwear in bags from start to finish.

Prizes and time of ceremony:

Prize ceremony at the event arena immediately after all classes have been decided. Expected 15.15. The winners in D21 and H21 receive DIF's championship medal. No. 2 and 3 receive DOF's championship medals following rules for Danish Championships.

Order Regulations:

The use of open flames and smoking on the competition site is not allowed.

There are toilets at the event arena and at the start.

The general rules for traffic in nature apply and dogs must be kept on a leash.

Doping control:

The event has been reported to Anti-Doping Denmark and doping control may occur.

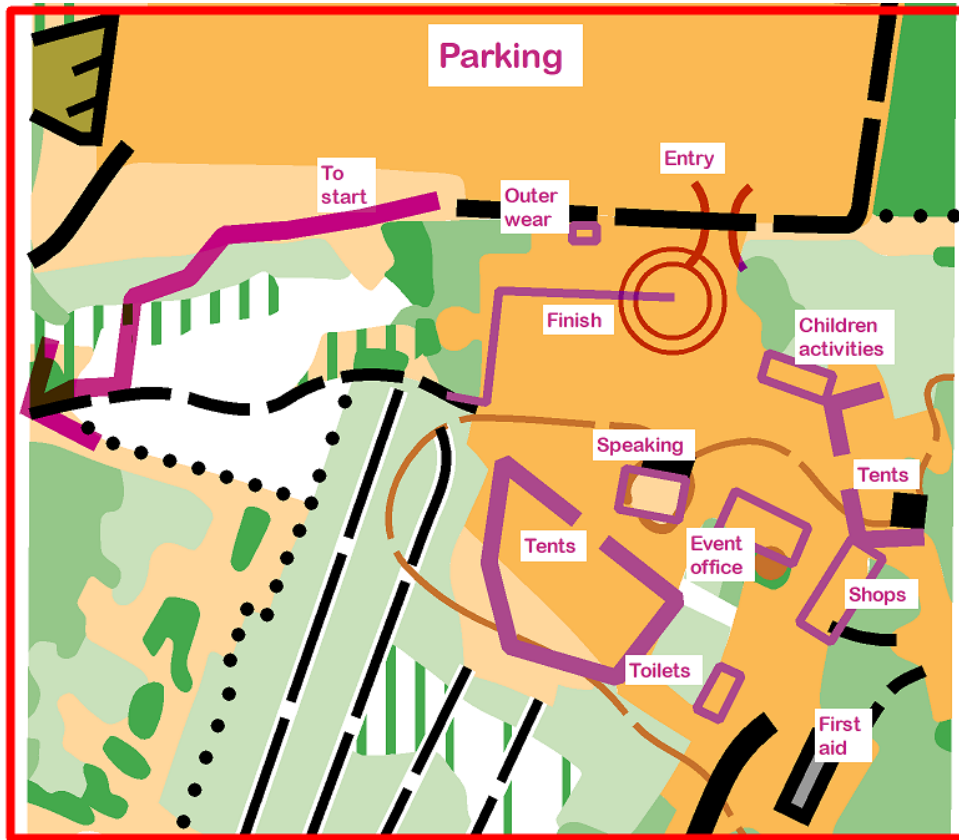
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
